- o Inspect for Partial Outages: If only part of your home is affected, identify which circuits are down to narrow down the cause .
- o Check GFCI Outlets: Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters may trip and cut power to connected outlets; reset them if necessary .
- o Verify External Power Supply: Confirm whether neighbors have power or check with your electricity provider to rule out a local outage .
- o Call a Licensed Electrician: If the problem persists, involves damaged wiring, or you are unsure, contact a professional to safely diagnose and repair the issue .

Safety Tips

- o Always turn off appliances before resetting breakers to prevent surges.
- o Avoid touching exposed wires or attempting complex repairs if you are not trained.
- o Use a flashlight instead of candles to reduce fire risk during outages.
- o Consider preventive maintenance on your distribution board to reduce future outages . By following these steps, you can often restore power safely and identify whether the issue is internal to your home or related to the external supply.
