- o Support and Stability: Even on the ground, trays should be properly supported to prevent sagging or movement. Supports or spacers can help maintain alignment and prevent direct contact with wet surfaces .

Grounding Requirements

Metallic cable trays must be grounded to ensure safety, even if they are not used as the equipment grounding conductor (EGC), . Key points include:

- o Bonding: Sections of metallic trays should be bonded together using clamps or connectors to maintain electrical continuity .
- o EGC Use: In qualifying installations, the tray itself can serve as the EGC if it meets cross-sectional area requirements, but a separate EGC conductor is often recommended for added safety .
- o Material Considerations: Avoid placing bare copper conductors in aluminum trays in moist environments to prevent electrolytic corrosion; insulated conductors with proper bonding are preferred .

Practical Recommendations

- o Cable Type: Only use tray-rated cables suitable for open-air or exposed environments .
- o Separation: Maintain separation between high-power and low-power cables to reduce electromagnetic interference (EMI), .
- o Fill Limits: Do not exceed the recommended fill capacity (typically 40-50% of tray cross-section) to prevent overheating .
- o Maintenance: Ensure that trays on the ground are not obstructed by equipment or foot traffic to allow safe

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access for inspection and cable work .
