Use an access port (typically an RJ45 Ethernet port) to connect end devices to a single VLAN on an access switch.

Access Port Overview

An access port is designed to connect end devices such as computers, printers, or servers to a switch and carry traffic for only one VLAN . Unlike trunk ports, which carry multiple VLANs, access ports are simpler to configure and ensure that the connected device is part of the correct broadcast domain . On Cisco switches, you configure a port as an access port using the `switchport mode access` command and assign it to a VLAN with `switchport access vlan` .

Physical Port Selection

- o RJ45 Ports: Most common for access-layer connections, supporting 1G speeds over Cat5e/Cat6 cables. Ideal for desktops, printers, and standard servers .
- o SFP/SFP+ Ports: Used for fiber connections or uplinks, typically for longer distances or higher bandwidth requirements. SFP ports can support 1G, while SFP+ supports 10G .
- o PoE Ports: If connecting devices like IP phones or wireless access points, choose a PoE-enabled RJ45 port to provide power over Ethernet .

Configuration Best Practices

- o Assign the correct VLAN: Ensure the access port is configured for the VLAN corresponding to the device's network segment .
- o Avoid using trunk ports for end devices: Trunk ports are meant for switch-to-switch links and carry multiple VLANs, which is unnecessary for single devices .
- o Host port designation: On some Cisco switches, marking a port as a host port optimizes forwarding and disables channel grouping, reducing configuration complexity .
- o Check speed and duplex: Match the port speed and duplex settings to the connected device to avoid performance issues.

Summary

For connecting end devices to an access switch, use an RJ45 access port configured for the appropriate VLAN. Reserve SFP/SFP+ ports for uplinks or fiber connections, and consider PoE if the device requires power over Ethernet. Proper configuration ensures the device is on the correct VLAN and maintains network efficiency and security .
