

The power distribution box has no voltage

Initial Safety Precautions

- o Inspect for overheating, burnt smells, or visible damage to breakers and terminals .
- o Check for environmental factors like moisture or corrosion that may degrade components .
- o Replace any faulty breakers or damaged components as needed.

Step 5: Test Individual Circuits

- o Use a voltage tester to check each circuit inside the box .



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o If some circuits have voltage while others do not, the issue may be localized to a specific breaker or connection.

Step 6: Seek Professional Help if Needed

o If the problem persists or you are unsure, consult a licensed electrician to avoid safety hazards and ensure proper repairs . By systematically checking the power source, connections, wiring, and components, you can identify why the distribution box has no voltage and take corrective action safely.
