The width of the working space must be at least 30 in. Minimum clearances are established for work spaces in front of high voltage - electrical equipment such as switchboards, control panels, switches, circuit breakers, switchgear and motor controllers. Working space: The front clearance, side clearance, and height clearance requirements for electrical equipment that provide a safe area for maintenance, inspections, and other work. 26 (A) requires a clear space at least 30 inches wide and 36 inches deep if the equipment is likely to be worked on while energized. Clearance: Electrical panels must be installed in a readily accessible area with a minimum clearance of 30 inches (762 mm) wide, 3 ft

Side clearance: There should be a minimum of 30 inches of clearance from the sides of all electrical equipment, but in no case less
