

Use DR circuit breaker for distribution box

A DR (RCCB/RCD) circuit breaker should be installed in a distribution box to protect against leakage currents and electric shocks, typically positioned after the main isolator and before branch MCBs.

Purpose of a DR Circuit Breaker

A DR circuit breaker, also called an RCCB (Residual Current Circuit Breaker) or RCD (Residual Current Device), is designed to detect leakage currents caused by insulation faults or accidental contact with live parts. When a leakage is detected, it trips the circuit immediately, preventing electric shocks and reducing fire risks ().

Installation in a Distribution Box

- o Positioning: The DR breaker is usually installed after the main isolator or main MCB and before the branch MCBs. This ensures that all downstream circuits are protected from leakage currents ().
- o Connection Sequence:
 - o Connect the incoming phase (L) and neutral (N) from the main supply to the input terminals of the DR breaker.
 - o The output terminals of the DR breaker then feed the branch MCBs, which protect individual circuits from overcurrent ().
- o Neutral and Earth:
 - o All neutral wires from the branch circuits should connect to the neutral bar after passing through the DR breaker.
 - o All earth wires connect to the ground bus bar to ensure proper fault current dissipation ().
- o Rating Selection:
 - o Choose a DR breaker with a current rating equal to or slightly higher than the main MCB.
 - o The sensitivity rating (typically 30mA for residential use) should match the level required for protection against electric shock ().

Safety and Compliance

- o Ensure neutral and earth bars remain separate to prevent fault currents from bypassing the DR breaker ().
- o Verify that the DR breaker is compatible with the voltage and phase type of the distribution box (single-phase or three-phase) ().
- o Conduct testing after installation to confirm the DR breaker trips correctly under simulated leakage conditions ().
