Inside the home, a small hole (6-10 mm) is typically drilled near existing internet entry points to connect the fiber to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which is sealed to prevent moisture . No-drill alternatives, such as adhesive-mounted conduits or window seals, are sometimes available for historic or rental properties .

Utility Easements and Access

Fiber installation often occurs within utility easements, which are legal rights allowing service providers to access certain areas of private property for infrastructure installation and maintenance . Easements are commonly located in front yards, side yards, or near streets, and construction crews may need temporary access to these areas. Homeowners are usually notified in advance, and restoration of lawns and landscaping is standard practice after installation .

Potential Electrical Sensitivity

While fiber optic cables themselves transmit data via light, the conversion to electrical signals at street-level or in-home equipment can generate electromagnetic interference (EMI) . Some individuals report increased electrical sensitivity due to EMI from fiber optic converters, especially when high-speed packages are used. Mitigation strategies include using lower bandwidth plans, isolating copper wiring, or maintaining service with non-fiber providers if sensitivity is an issue .

Duration and Disruption
