

# What category do explosion-proof distribution boxes belong to

- o Oil/Sand-Filled Type (Ex o / Ex q): Uses special media inside the enclosure to prevent flame or heat transfer. This type is less common and requires specific maintenance, often used in specialized industrial applications .

### Classification by Hazardous Area

Explosion-proof distribution boxes are also classified according to the hazardous area zones they are designed for:

- o Zone 0 / 20: Continuous presence of explosive gases or dust.
- o Zone 1 / 21: Likely presence of explosive gases or dust during normal operation.
- o Zone 2 / 22: Unlikely presence of explosive gases or dust, or only for short periods .

### Material and Structural Considerations

- o Materials: Stainless steel, aluminum, or composite materials are commonly used for corrosion resistance and mechanical strength .
- o Ingress Protection (IP): IP65 or higher is recommended for outdoor or humid environments, with IP66/IP67 for extreme conditions .
- o Design Features: Include flameproof joints, sealing rings, cable entries, and internal mounting brackets. Modular designs allow easier maintenance and future expansion .

### Certification Standards

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Certified explosion-proof distribution boxes comply with international standards such as ATEX, IECEx, and NEMA, ensuring suitability for specific hazardous environments and legal compliance. Regular inspection and maintenance are essential to maintain safety and operational integrity.
