

What components are included in a cable tray

Tray Sections

Fittings are used to connect, change direction, or branch the tray system:

- o Elbows: Horizontal or vertical bends to navigate corners.
- o Tees and crosses: For branching or intersecting pathways.
- o Reducers: Adjust tray width to accommodate different cable volumes.
- o Splices and couplers: Join tray sections securely .

Supports

Supports provide structural stability and maintain proper alignment:

- o Wall brackets: Mount trays to walls.
- o Ceiling hangers: Suspend trays from ceilings.
- o Floor stands or pedestals: Support trays at ground level.
- o Struts and clamps: Secure trays and prevent sagging .

Accessories

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Accessories enhance functionality, safety, and organization:

- o Covers: Protect cables from dust, debris, or mechanical damage.
- o Cable clamps and ties: Keep cables organized within the tray.
- o Earthing and bonding kits: Ensure electrical safety for metal trays.
- o End caps and dividers: Prevent cable movement and separate different cable types .
