- o Aging or insufficient maintenance of components inside the box

Preventive Measures

- o Ensure tight, secure connections and proper torque on bolts and terminals
- o Avoid overloading circuits and use correctly rated breakers

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- o Regularly inspect and clean the distribution box to prevent dust and debris buildup
- o Install boxes in dry, ventilated, and non-flammable areas
- o Replace aging or damaged components promptly to prevent arcing or overheating

- o Immediately cut off power to prevent further damage or fire .
- o Do not attempt to operate the system until inspected by a qualified electrician.
- o Assess and replace damaged components, including wires, breakers, and the distribution box itself.
