- o Limited Functionality: Unlike switches, splitters do not manage traffic or prevent collisions; they simply replicate or divide the signal .
- o Deployment Flexibility: Splitters can be centralized (located in a central office or cabinet) or distributed (placed closer to end users), affecting network design and maintenance .

- o Connecting multiple devices in a home or office where only one Ethernet drop is available.
- o Extending fiber optic networks to multiple endpoints without laying additional fiber.

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o Temporary or low-bandwidth setups where installing new cables is difficult.
