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- o Regular Interval Fixing: Secure cables at consistent spacing to prevent sagging and reduce stress on terminals .
- o Tray Size and Cable Fill: Ensure tray capacity is not exceeded (typically 40% fill) to maintain airflow and prevent overheating .
- o Inspection and Maintenance: Check supports, clamps, and cable organization periodically to ensure long-term system integrity .
