

What quota should be applied to the micro-module computer room

Article Overview

A micro-module computer room should be designed with a power density exceeding 20 W/ft², adequate cooling capacity, and flexible power distribution to ensure safe and efficient operation.

Power and Equipment Quota

For a micro-module computer room, the equipment power density should generally exceed 20 watts per square foot of conditioned floor area to qualify as a computer room . Power distribution should include flexible connections capable of supporting various kW loads, voltages (e.g., 208/120V, 400/230V), and ampacities . An uninterruptible power supply (UPS) is essential to maintain continuous operation, and emergency shutdowns should be parceled to avoid unintentional outages .

Cooling and Environmental Quota

Cooling systems must be sized to handle the total IT load. For small installations, exceptions exist for units under 5 tons of cooling capacity, but all systems should maintain recommended temperature ranges for IT equipment . Hot/cold aisle containment is recommended to optimize airflow and reduce energy consumption . Raised floors with perforated tiles or panels are advised to facilitate efficient air distribution .

Space and Layout Quota

The room should provide sufficient floor space and height to accommodate racks, storage units, and overhead power distribution . A minimum of 18-24 inches (46-61 cm) between the raised floor and structural deck is recommended for cabling and airflow . Blanking panels should be used in cabinets to prevent short-circuiting of airflow .

Security and Compliance

Even for small micro-module rooms, access should be restricted to authorized personnel, and the room should be operated as a closed security area . Fire and smoke compartments should be implemented to protect equipment beyond minimum building code requirements .
