

What quota should be used for cable tray hangers

Article Overview

Cable tray support hangers should typically be spaced between 1.5 meters and 3 meters, depending on tray type, load, and installation conditions, in accordance with IEC 61537 and NEMA VE 2 standards.

Recommended Support Spacing

- o Straight horizontal runs: Supports are generally installed every 1.5 to 3 meters. The exact spacing depends on the tray type (ladder, perforated, or solid-bottom), material, and the total cable load .
- o Vertical runs: Supports should be placed at intervals not exceeding 1.5 meters to maintain stability .
- o Concentrated loads: Extra supports are required near cable entry/exit points, bends, or where heavy cables drop in or out .
- o Long-span trays: For specially reinforced trays, spans up to 6 meters may be possible, but these require thicker tray sides and careful load calculations .

Calculation Method

To determine the number of supports for a given tray length, the following formula is commonly used:
$$\text{Support Quantity} = (\text{Total Tray Length} / \text{Support Spacing}) + 1$$
For example, a 20-meter tray with 2-meter spacing requires 11 supports, including both ends .

Compliance and Safety Considerations

- o Standards: Ensure compliance with IEC 61537 for mechanical strength, corrosion resistance, and electrical continuity, and NEC Article 392 for installation practices .
- o Load capacity: Supports must handle the maximum expected cable load with an appropriate safety factor.
- o Environmental factors: Outdoor, industrial, or corrosive environments may require galvanized, epoxy-coated, or stainless steel supports .
- o Fire protection: In some installations, supports must meet fire-resistance ratings per IEC 60331 or NFPA standards .

Types of Supports

- o Wall-mounted brackets: For horizontal trays along walls.
- o Ceiling-hung supports (threaded rods, trapeze hangers): Common in indoor electrical rooms.
- o Floor-mounted pedestals: For raised floors in substations or data centers.
- o Cantilever brackets: For external or side support in narrow spaces . By following these spacing guidelines and standards, cable tray systems will maintain structural integrity, ensure safety, and provide long-term

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reliability.
