

What s inside the electrical distribution box

A complete electrical distribution box contains circuit breakers, fuses, busbars, RCDs/RCBOs, neutral and earth bars, and sometimes surge protection devices to safely distribute and protect electricity.

Core Components

1. Main Switch: Controls the incoming power supply and allows complete isolation of the distribution box for maintenance or emergencies . 2. Circuit Breakers (MCBs): Protect individual circuits from overloads and short circuits by automatically disconnecting power when abnormal current is detected . 3. Residual Current Devices (RCDs) / RCBOs: Provide protection against earth faults and leakage currents, enhancing safety for users and equipment . 4. Fuses: Serve as an additional protective layer, melting to break the circuit in case of excessive current . 5. Busbars: Conduct electricity from the main supply to multiple outgoing circuits. Typically, separate busbars are used for live, neutral, and earth connections . 6. Neutral and Earth Bars: Organize and connect all neutral and protective earth wires, ensuring proper grounding and safe operation . 7. Surge Protective Devices (SPDs): Protect sensitive equipment from voltage spikes caused by lightning or switching surges . 8. Indication Lights and Monitoring Units: Some modern or smart DB boxes include visual indicators for mains availability, energy monitoring, and communication modules for remote control .

Additional Features

- o Enclosure: Made from thermoplastics like polycarbonate or ASA, or epoxy-coated/powder-coated steel, providing protection against dust, moisture, impact, and environmental stress .
- o DIN Rails: Standardized mounting rails for easy installation of breakers and other modular devices .
- o Cable Entries and Wiring Space: Designed to organize incoming and outgoing cables efficiently while allowing heat dissipation .
