

What type of optical cable is best for New Zealand

Single-mode fibre optic cables are generally the best choice for New Zealand's high-speed broadband and long-distance data transmission needs.

Recommended Fibre Types

Single-mode fibre (SMF) is ideal for New Zealand because it supports ultra-fast broadband (UFB) and long-distance transmission with minimal signal loss, making it suitable for both residential and commercial installations. It uses a small core (typically 8-10 μm) and a laser light source, allowing data to travel over tens of kilometers without significant attenuation. Multi-mode fibre (MMF) is better for shorter distances, such as within buildings or campuses, due to its larger core (50-62.5 μm) and LED light source. While cheaper and easier to install, it has higher signal loss over long distances, making it less suitable for New Zealand's UFB network.

Cable Construction Considerations

- o Armoured vs Non-Armoured: For outdoor or underground installations, especially in areas prone to rodents or mechanical impact, armoured cables with steel or rodent-resistant layers are recommended. Examples include Corrugated Steel Tape Armoured cables or NoR@T rodent-proof dielectric cables.
- o Sheath Material: UV-stabilised polyethylene (PE) or Low Smoke Zero Halogen (LS0H) sheaths are preferred for durability and safety in New Zealand's varied climate.
- o Loose Tube vs FlexTube: Loose tube cables are common for external installations, while FlexTube or micromodule designs offer higher fibre density and easier handling for large-scale projects.

Local Network Compatibility

New Zealand's UFB network predominantly uses GPON technology, which is compatible with single-mode fibre. This ensures maximum speed, reliability, and future-proofing for high-bandwidth applications like 4K streaming, gaming, and multiple simultaneous users.

Summary Recommendation

For most New Zealand applications:

- o Outdoor/long-distance: Single-mode, armoured, loose tube or FlexTube cable with PE or LS0H sheath.
 - o Indoor/short-distance: Single-mode or multi-mode, non-armoured, with standard protective jackets.
- Choosing single-mode fibre with appropriate armouring and sheath material ensures high-speed, reliable, and

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durable connectivity across New Zealand's UFB infrastructure .
