Electrical distribution boxes in workshops are typically numbered using a standardized system that combines equipment type, location, voltage, and sequential identifiers to ensure clarity and traceability.

Key Principles of Numbering

- o Unique Identification: Each distribution box or panelboard should have a unique identifier to avoid confusion and facilitate maintenance, inventory, and safety compliance .
- o Sequential Numbering: Assign numbers in order, such as E-001, E-002, E-003, for each new panel or box. This is simple to implement and ensures every unit has a distinct ID .
- o Location-Based Naming: Incorporate the physical location of the box, e.g., E-101-1 for the first box in Room 101. This helps maintenance personnel quickly locate equipment .
- o Voltage and Equipment Type Codes: Include a voltage code (e.g., 01 for 115V, 20 for 13.8kV) and a letter or abbreviation for the equipment type (e.g., SW for switchboard, MCC for motor control center), .
- o Serial Numbers and Identifiers: For multiple identical units, use a single-letter identifier (A, B, C) or a serial number to distinguish them, e.g., MCC-A01 for the first MCC in a series .

Example Numbering Format

A practical format for a workshop distribution box could be structured as follows: -[Equipment Type]--[Serial/Sequence]

- o Room 101, Low Voltage Switchboard, First Unit: 101-SW-01-01
- o Motor Control Center in Workshop, Second Unit: WS-MCC-01-02
- o Additional identical switchboard: 101-SW-01-02 This format ensures that each box is uniquely identifiable, indicates its location, type, and voltage, and allows for easy expansion as new equipment is added.

Best Practices

- o Maintain a Master Tag List: Keep a centralized database of all equipment IDs for reference and updates .
 - o Label Panels Clearly: Place labels on the front of the box and inside the panel door for easy identification .
 - o Update Documentation: Ensure panel schedules, schematics, and maintenance logs reflect any changes in numbering .
 - o Consistency: Use the same format across the workshop to avoid confusion and simplify training for staff .
- By following these conventions, workshop electrical distribution boxes can be systematically numbered, improving safety, maintenance efficiency, and compliance with electrical standards.
